

AUDITING

A student must register to audit a course and is expected to participate in the work of the course. Auditors do not take the final examination. No credit is earned and no grade is given by auditing. Students may audit undergraduate courses on a space available basis, subject to the audit fee when applicable. Normally, the audit fee is one-third of the tuition charge of the course. Independent studies, directed studio projects, tutorials, internships, and skills based courses (music lessons, studio courses, labs) cannot be taken on an audit basis. Normally, audits are not allowed for professional courses. The last date to change from credit to audit is published in the academic calendar. Non-matriculated students who wish to audit a course must obtain the approval of the Department Chairperson of the course on an Audit Approval Form and submit it to the Registrar's Office; blank forms are available in the Registrar's Office. Auditors must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. **Current students may register for an audit on-line.**
