A Resource File

Includes:

All the lesson plans that you have designed/taught, rewrites and supporting documentation.

Class assignments that are connected to your teaching practice. (Timelines, developmental categories, Isms assignment, lists of possible conceptual themes).

Handouts/examples on teaching strategies, classroom management and assessment systems.

Resource lists of web sites, books, reproductions, quotes and journal articles that are meaningful to you.

Photographs of teaching situations, classroom environments, displays and teaching aids.

A Developmental Portfolio

Includes:

The Student teaching goal worksheets listing what the student has done to achieve each individual goal.

Artifacts or pieces of physical evidence that have been collected to prove that the student has achieved the student teaching goals.

A Professional Portfolio

Includes:

Professionally presented visual and written artifact that represent the student's skills and aptitudes as a beginning art teacher.
