



Configure Windows 98 SE

Setting Up a Network Connection in Windows 98 SE

The following instructions assume that a network card has been installed in the computer or that the computer was purchased with a network card installed.

1. Click on **Start** → **Settings** → **Control Panel**
2. Double-click **Network**
3. Is the following displayed on the screen?

"Your network is not complete. Do you want to continue?"

If the answer is yes, go to step 4, if the answer is no, go to step 7

4. Click **Yes**
5. Click the **Add** button
6. Double-click **Protocol**
7. Click **Microsoft**
Scroll down and choose **TCP/IP**
Click **OK**
8. The **Configuration** tab should be visible
Change the *Primary Network Logon* to **Windows Logon**
Click on the **Identification** tab
9. Fill in the *Computer Name* box with your first and last name (i.e. John Doe)
In the *Workgroup* box, type `student`
In the *Computer Description* box, type the name of your residence hall and your room number (i.e. Lyons #10)
Click on the Configuration Tab
10. Double-click on **TCP/IP**
11. Click on the **IP Address** tab
Click on the **Obtain an IP address automatically** button
Click on the **WINS Configuration** tab

12. Click on the **Use DHCP for WINS Resolution** button
Click on the **DNS Configuration** tab
13. Click on the **Disable DNS** button
Click on the **Gateway** tab
14. Remove any numbers that appear in the boxes
Click on **OK** to close this window
15. Click on **OK** again to close the *Network* dialog box
16. You will be prompted to restart your computer
Click **Yes**
