Elaine Ringelstein Urlaub Internship Award

The Elaine Ringelstein Urlaub Internship Award is an endowed internship that is awarded annually. Eligibility for the Internship is restricted to juniors and seniors majoring in Sociology who have a GPA of 3.4 or higher. The Urlaub Internship Trust pays the tuition for a three-credit internship for the recipient. The internship site is chosen each year.

The endowment for Urlaub Internship was created by Warren G. Urlaub and his wife, Elaine Ringelstein Urlaub, who was a 1948 graduate of Nazareth College. Mrs. Urlaub passed away in 2001. The Urlaub family has a long history with Nazareth College. Mr. Urlaub's father ran the company which constructed many of the original buildings on the Pittsford campus. Mrs. Urlaub taught Sociology at Nazareth College for several years and also worked for Monroe County as a child welfare social worker. Sharing the advantage of the opportunity that she had to learn and grow at Nazareth College prompted the Urlaub's generosity in establishing the internship.
